ECHOES wants to hear from **cultural heritage professionals** to gather information on the tools and services that you use and need. We are particularly interested in receiving feedback from smaller institutions and professionals involved in less mainstream cultural heritage activities.

The Consultation process starts with a questionnaire designed to collect information about the wider community, normal working practices and what they expect from the Cultural Heritage Cloud infrastructure. This survey will be followed up by a series of workshops, focus groups and targeted interviews. All this information will enable ECHOES to build a collaborative community around a cloud infrastructure designed to meet everyone's needs.
