

Communities pillar: general objectives







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Aim of the Consultation

- Produce a strategy for community building
- Inform the infrastructure design and technological choices of the Cloud
- Identify additional actors that want to be actively involved
- Provide the first integrative activities for the community
- Prepare new community and capacity-building activities for the next project phases



















Mapping of interest

- Open call for interest in a Cultural Heritage Cloud from May to July 2023
- 247 letters of interest across x countries
- Semantic analysis by CNRS/ University of Tours using ALCEST software.
- First mapping of needs, offers, technologies and intentions by various Cultural Heritage institutions or research organisations.







Internal consultation

- An internal consultation on the community needs and available tools
- More than 30 entries from European or national research infrastructures or projects

1st step: the Questionnaire

- Questionnaire available online on Limesurvey, in English. Glossary in progress, with translations of some specific/techincal terms.
 - Mapping of the communities of Cultural Heritage as well as their current digital practices.
 - Identify the topics to be discussed during the complementary activities of the Consultation: workshops, focus groups and interviews.

2nd step: Workshop, focus groups and interviews

- Target groups or topics of interest identified through the questionnaire or previous initiatives.
- Federate communities and discuss the project's ideas for the future Cloud and its services.
- Include communities that might be overlooked (students and young professionals, CCI, intangible heritage, etc.).






A6. Which of the following best describes your professional activity or the field(s) in which your work primarily fits?





D8. Do you document the data you produce (with explanatory notes, annotations, metadata, etc.)?






